Minutes of Regular meeting
September 25, 1985

Acting President, Kay Smith, opened meeting at 7:37 pm in the Airport Terminal Bldg. There were 45 members attending. Kay told the general membership about the action the Board of Directors had taken in granting a loan of \$2,000 to Dick White's family immediately after the accident. The action required membership approval and was moved, seconded and approved. Also, the club has received several contributions in memory of Dick and Corrine. We will be sending a letter acknowledging these to the White family. Elections coming up - ballots at October meeting so please try to attend. Changes in the by laws were discussed, the most significant allowing the board to authorize up to \$250 per month expenditures instead of \$100. This was moved, seconded and approved. Program for next month was discussed, Hal Wight with answers concerning issues we particularly wanted to know more about. Refer to September newsletter for partial listing, call us to add more. Kay told of the county's approval of mounting our "Member of the Year" plaque in the terminal building for display. Wed., Oct. 2, is the date of next meeting for Contra Costa Airport Alliance. This is the project to build a facility for several aviation clubs and organizations to use -Kay will report progress. There was no report available from the Airport Advisory Committee. Calendar- Sat., Sept. 28, is informal Rio Vista fly-in lunch, Oct. 4-6 California Aviation Council membership meeting at Sheraton. We've been asked to provide an informal forum on homebuilding and a small static display of aircraft. Christmas dinner Dec. 13th - mark your calendars! The program will again be a slide show of Chapter members and their projects, so please take a roll of slide film, put it in your camera and fire away! Send the slides to Sasha Munir or Rich Powell. Travis Air Museum is moving to a new building so the fly-in visit must be put off until spring. Kay discussed briefly the NPRM about Recreational Pilots Licenses and how a simple proposal has turned into a monster - we must write and express our opinion by October 24th at the latest. Kay had some letters that were available at front table to sign which will be forwarded to FAA. also was noted that Flight Following radar won't call anybody when you leave screen or ATC - not required by them. Introductions were started and Acting President, Kay, sat down and wiped her brow... Program was an Oshkosh slide show by Rich Powell , followed by some good videos of OSH by Jim Kirby.

Bits and pieces of information: The Christmas Awards Banquet is coming together quite nicely. More on the contaminated oil: from the FAA comes word that analysis has verified that batches of Phillips 66 20W-50 X/C and Mobil 20W-50 Aero Super oil are contaminated with sand and iron! The contaminated oil can be identified by batch numbers printed on shipping cases. This really isn't a big help as very few of us ever lay an eye on the 'shipping case', but for the Phillips oil, the batch numbers are B16614, B16740, B15533, B16703 and L907. For the Mobil Oil, the batch numbers are 18B5H, 19B5H and 20B5H. Anyone finding contaminated oil of either brand is asked to contact the nearest FAA office.

I want to say many thanks to those Chapter members who assisted with the California Aviation Council convention - including bringing aircraft for display - beautiful birds from Dwain, Norm Alumbaugh, Carlos, Rick Lambert, Rich Powell, Sasha and it was a real pleasure to see Dick White with the Acro Sport. As you can see, we had a nice variety of beautiful chapter projects on display. It was a disappointment that there was a very small turnout for an important event, the CAC Convention. Many thanks also, to the fourteen members who made up our forum....which in reality was not much more than a mini chapter meeting. Representing Chapter #393, Rich Powell and Kay Smith attended the CAC luncheon and Saturday evening banquet. While the Banquet didn't produce a great deal of information, the luncheon did and Rich Powell will be giving us a report on what he learned at the luncheon, at our meeting. The CAC is doing very important work and deserves our support....basically, they are our ONLY representation with the State government. Chapter #393 is a member and after talking with CAC representatives and reviewing activities designed solely to benefit general aviation, your nosey newsey 'put her money where her mouth is' - I joined. 


