SAFETY TIP

Ridge and Canyon Flying - When crossing a ridge, the flight path should be at a 45 degree angle to the ridge, so that if you decide to peel out due to inadequate altitude or downdraft, a lesser turn will be required to get headed downhill again. When flying a canyon or valley, stay to one side, preferably the side where the air is flowing upslope. If it becomes necessary to make a 180, you will have more area to turn, you will be turning toward lower terrain and you will be turning into the wind. Knowing the turning radius of your plane is as important as knowing the turning radius for your car. Remember that a turning radius is increased by higher true aisrspeeds at altitude. Also remember to maintain airspeed in downdrafts, and remember that by putting the aircraft nose down and speeding up, the time spent in the downdraft is decreased. Watch the powerlines strung across the canyon!
