Want to help kids build an Airplane?

A program is now forming at Athenian School in Danville to build an airplane. Our new Chapter 393 member, Marsh Freeman, has worked it out with the Administration and key faculty at the school to undertake the building of a Wag-Aero Sport Trainer (Super Piper Cub). The project is now committed on both sides, parts are on order, and the shop to build it in is going through the approval and building process. The estimated starting date is in January, 2003.

The project is looking for fellow EAA members with skills in various areas of building to volunteer to help as group leaders, mentors, or experts called in for specific tasks. Marsh plans to be there every day, but he's asking for those who might like to help on specific tasks. As of now, the tasks are foreseen as:

Aeronautical Background: John Cavolowsky of NASA has volunteered Wood work (wings) Jim Mandley has volunteered Welding (fuselage and tail feathers)

Sheet metal (cowling): Electrical (basic): Engine (Lyc 0290 overhaul): Control Systems (cable): Composites (various small components): Covering (dacron and dope):

Athenian School is a private school located at the base of Mt. Diablo on the Danville city entrance side. It has about 400 students in grades 6-12, and about 40 of the students board there. The shop being built on the school grounds will be 40' x 40'; big enough to assemble the plane as it nears completion, and big enough to have 3 simultaneous "production lines" for wings, fuselage, and engine. A deal has been worked out with Ken Tunnell at Ly-Con in Visalia to buy a run-out Lyc 0290 (125 hp), bring it up to the school and have the students take it apart, then send the parts back to Ly-Con to have it put back together as an overhaul.

7. Pat described his desire to be able to provide food for the pilots and children at Young Eagles events. He suggested, and the board approved, getting a wiener roasting machine. Pat will proceed...

8. Tracy is working on getting a fuel donation from Chevron for our Young Eagles activities. Dennis Byron has contacted Chevron.

9. Guy Jones attended the EAA Leadership session at Oakdale on Oct 26 and reported on ideas to encourage new members and more participation by existing members. One suggestion was a pot luck before the meeting, a few times a year. This would help get wives, children and other family members involved. There was general agreement to do this, weather and day light permitting.

10. Guy Jones asked for authorization to offer overnight lodging for our November Speaker, Lane Wallace of Flying Magazine. This was approved by the board. Tracy suggests speaking to the manager at the Sheraton about a discount for a non-profit's speaker. Tracy got a rate of \$79 in a similar situation.

11. Pat Peters suggested that we send meeting and speaker information to the Golden West web site. Harvard looked at the web site and where this would go is not clear.

12. Tracy has 28 Boy Scouts who want to do a project for the airport. Any ideas? One suggestion was to re-stain the public viewing platform.
