1. Secretary's report (by Pete Mitchell):

We have 53 paying members and 2 life members.

Pete has applied for the S.H.A.R.E.S. program with Lucky Supermarkets:

http://www.luckysupermarketsshares.com/index_ lucky_php He has applied for 200 cards, which we just hand out to members.

Jack Davi reported that Julie Conti in the Airport office volunteered to help with our outreach to pilots by emailing them information about EAA. He suggested **Bill Reining** to write a great letter. Harvard Holmes noted that our Web page <u>http://www.eaa393.org/About/join393.php</u> tells prospective members to contact the Chapter before joining EAA National. Our membership application form has a similar message. [Harvard called EAA National and was told that no program giving "credit" for applying through a chapter is currently in effect. We need to revise the Web page and our membership application. **Renee** is our Webmaster.]

Treasurer's report (by Bob Belshe):

Our current assets are \$3422 in cash and \$1230 in Young Eagle credits. \$1000 of the Young Eagle credits has been committed to sending our Air Academy candidate (Brandon Chang from the Sea Cadets). The remaining amount \$230 needs to be documented as covering YE expenses and submitted as soon as we reach that level of expense. **Bob Belshe** and **Renee Robinson** are the resources for this.

Bob proposed that if we have enough computers, that the treasurer's data could be put on one of the Chapter's computers. He could then bring it to the meeting to be more responsive to questions, and it could be passed on to the next treasurer when a new person is elected. This idea was moved, seconded, and approved.

2. Young Eagles Rally Planning (Renee Robinson and Jack Davi):

Jack reported: He is just starting to work on the June 15 rally. Our sign near the golf course needs help – it looks like one corner is untied. The Civil Air Patrol (CAP) will help us again. Our signs for the rest of the year are done. Our chairs/tents/stanchions are stored in the "garage." They will remain until October (then back to PSA?). Our signs and newspaper articles should build attendance. There is a question about whether we get credit for **second rides** for kids (unresolved). PSA will provide discounted fuel (\$3/gal discount) for the June 15 event. (Sterling did the last one at \$2/gal discount.) CAP wants us to give CAP kids rides (assuming they're the correct age 8-17) as the CAP aircraft is so busy that many CAP kids never get airplane flights.

3, Clubhouse picnic area plans

Jack Davi noted that Beth Lee at the Airport has asked for a priority list of improvements to the Clubhouse, including the picnic area, air conditioners and lighting for the "fireplace" room. **Bill Reining** and **Scott Achelis**, in consultation with MDPA, have the ball on this.

4. June 26 General Meeting

Rick Bourgeois plans a menu of baked ziti, green beans, salad, garlic bread, drinks and dessert. Tracy Peters was not available to announce a speaker.

5. Future speakers – Tracy Peters and Jack Davi

Rick Bourgeois knows of a survivor of the WW II battleship Indianapolis who is a good speaker.

8. Air Academy Candidate (by Tracy Peters)

Others reported: Brandon Chang from the Sea Cadets will go.

9. BBQ Plans (by Tracy Peters)

Our Chapter Picnic is scheduled for Saturday, July 20, 2013 at 11:30 am (?).

10. Miscellaneous Items – actions and status

- 1. Outside loudspeaker: -- Tracy Peters and Lee Teicheira in charge. Tom Howard reported a source for secondhand outdoor speakers.
- 2. P.A. & Projector wiring Tracy Peters and Lee Teicheira

Items 10.(3, 4, 5), see 3. Clubhouse picnic area plans (develop priority list).

- 3. Fans for fireplace room
- 4. A/C for fireplace room
- 5. A/C for main meeting room

- YE flight simulator: we have computers now (thanks to Tom Howard), "controls," and software. We need a guru, maybe from CAP? We might also get some DVD movies and show them to keep the kids occupied; Rick Bourgeois has "Top Gun."
- 7. Tom Howard gave a status report on the Chapter tool lending library: The bore scope has seen little demand. Tom has the old (bathroom) Chapter scales. Tom has the non-working compressor; he has evaluated it and finds the motor is dead and not easily fixed. It is a 240-volt only motor. It was moved, seconded and approved to authorize **Tom Howard** to get rid of it. [**Bill Reining** would like to see if any pieces fit his old compressor before it is finally disposed of.] A note in the Cleco could advertise our tools from time to time (**Bill Bower**).
- 8. VariEze: -- Dick Sperling is getting an RV-12, so the VariEze needs a home and the YE rallies would like to display it. During discussion, there was concern about deterioration from weather if the VariEze was kept outside. Jack Davi will ask the Airport if we can display it outside the Clubhouse. If so, then Dick Sperling can proceed with cleaning up the VariEze for display. It needs sharp edges removed before we can let kids near it.

11. We need some display space for pictures, awards, etc. during our meetings. Jack Davi will ask the Airport if we can put some stuff on the walls. If not, Rich Bourgeois will build a portable easel.

12. A Young Eagles event at Byron

There was considerable discussion. Several folks have spoken to Dave Wrangler at the Patriots Foundation. Suggestions covered the range:

Chapter 393 adds Byron to our scope and we do the YE events;

Byron pilots come to Concord and we help them learn how to do it themselves.

Jack Davi noted that our schedule is set this year and is full; we can't do much for them this year. **Jack Davi** will invite Byron pilots to fly for our YE events

13. Hot dog sales at Watsonville Labor Day Air Show

Jack Davi reported that things are going well. Tracy Peters and Rick Bourgeois (with 1 daughter) will be there and he has local volunteers. He will buy the food locally (in Santa Cruz), so he does not end up with lots of left over food.

14. Golden West -- Chapter displays of aircraft

Harvard Holmes asked if anyone knew of aircraft planning to attend. No one did, so no official participation is expected.

Generally, someone who wants to go flying will send a suggestion to this list a day or two before. Those who can go will respond, and a destination gets selected. Recent destinations have included: Half Moon Bay, Petaluma, Santa Rosa, Ukiah, Boonville, Shelter Cove, Willows, Auburn, Sacramento, Lodi, Stockton, Merced, Watsonville and Salinas. If the weather is poor, a destination may be selected as late as Wednesday morning.

The most active pilots on this list are Harvard Holmes, Bill Reining, Bob Belshe, Ron Robinson, and Phil Jenkins. Pilots sometimes advertise that they have empty seats, but not always. Harvard Holmes and Bill Reining are most likely to have extra seats (4 seat aircraft). My advice is to contact a pilot in advance to make sure they have room and to get directions. Typically, you'd get to the airport by 11:30am and return by 3:30pm.
