Bill O'Brian is developing a presentation using tripods to show member project progress.



(120 lb) capacity. Baggage locker in turtleback, capacity 9 kg (20 lb) Construction: Braced wings of composite wood and light alloy construction, fabric covered. Welded steel tube fuselage (with light alloy stringers) and tail structures, fabric covered. Non-retractable

History: Following equipment manufacture, aircraft development work and the restoration of a Curtiss Robin aircraft, the Javelin Aircraft Company began the development of a biplane of its own design on 1 January 1964. The resulting aircraft, named Wichawk, has structural geometry similar to that of a Stearman biplane, as well as some of the latter's aerodynamic features, and is stressed for +12 and -6g. It flew for the first time on 24 May 1971 and has received FAA certification in the Experimental (homebuilt) category. Javelin Aircraft does not build the Wichawk, but plans, wing ribs and fuel tanks are available to amateur constructors. More than 100 Wichawks are known to be under construction
