Gone West

It is with great sadness that we learned of the death of Rick Lambert, longtime member and technical counselor of Chapter 393. Rick died Sunday evening July 19, 2020 at the age of 84.

Coming up next we have a report of members helping members with repairs on their airplanes accompanied by pictures to prove the story.

FIBERGLASS REPAIRS WITH RON LEM – RV-6A

June 2020

Sara and Harvard Holmes gave a fiberglass class as a parallel project with the Don Baldwin Sonex project to work on the cowl. Ron Lem attended some of these classes, as he wanted to do some repairs to his RV-6A lower engine cowl in preparation for selling his airplane.

Then the pandemic hit and the classes came to a halt. After several months, we offered to help Ron with his repairs, while social distancing as much as possible.

There were several issues:

1. There was a hole worn in the cowl from the alternator pulley. We repaired the cowl with a slight bump in the fiberglass to allow a little more space for the alternator pulley.

- 2. There were cracks around the section of the cowl, which holds the airbox. Most of them were superficial in the paint, which required bodywork. We reinforced the cowling on the inside with layers of fiberglass. Where the cowling attaches to the bottom of the fuselage, it appears that the cowling had gotten warped, and the hinge pins no longer went all of the way in, and some of the hinge loops were missing. We built up around the warped area to create a smooth surface for the hinge connection. Then we riveted a new section of hinge in. While working in this area, we found heat damage from the cabin heat muff on the exhaust pipe. Ron reviewed the heat muff and discovered that the mounting flanges could be turned around to give clearance from the cowling, which he did. Later we used high temperature spray paint to paint the inside of the cowl, and then applied heat shield, which has an aluminum reflective material with insulation. It has an adhesive backing.
- 3. Where the lower cowl meets the upper cowl, some of the hinge loops had broken off. Bill Black provided some piano hinge material. We cut off the existing broken portion and installed a new section of piano hinge with epoxy and flox, and then riveted it into place.
- 4. We helped Ron get started on sanding and filling the cracks on the outside of his cowl.

Follow up: Ron sold his RV-6A and delivered it to its new owner in Nut Tree on 16 July. He will now be looking for rides with other pilots!








Recent destinations have included: South Lake Tahoe, Half Moon Bay, Petaluma, Santa Rosa, Ukiah, Boonville, Shelter Cove, Willows, Auburn, Sacramento, Lodi, Stockton, Merced, Watsonville and Salinas. If the weather is poor, a destination may be selected as late as Wednesday morning.
