YOUNG EAGLE TAKES FLIGHT THEN BECOMES TEENAGE PILOT

Alexander (Zander) Lieske developed an interest in flying at a young age which led him to the Civil Air Patrol. He joined Squadron 44 (Buchanan Field in Concord) at age 13, and he loved volunteering as ground crew to assist with the Young Eagle Flights that EAA Chapter 393 provides.

In 2017 Zander applied for and was selected to attend a two-week CAP flight academy in Fremont, Nebraska. While that was an amazing part of his summer, the real highlight for Zander was receiving the Chapter 393 scholarship to attend the EAA Air Academy at Oshkosh. That week was filled with great activities and experiences that solidified Zander's desire to pursue a career in aviation.

Zander continued his flight training at Oakland Flyers, and he completed his training at Sterling Aviation in Concord, where he soloed at his 17th birthday and obtained his private pilot's license. For his senior project at St. Mary's College High School in Berkeley, Zander decided to participate in a Young Eagles Flight day, which culminated in him providing flights to kids at a Young Eagles event at the airport in Byron, California in April 2019. From a volunteer on the ground to a pilot in the air in two years is an accomplishment of which Zander is very proud.

After graduating from high school in 2019, Zander moved to South Carolina where he attended Clemson University. Zander received a US Air force scholarship to attend Clemson University, but chose to follow a civilian path to aviation. While at Clemson, he continued his flight training at US Aero Flight in Greenville, South Carolina. There he obtained his instrument rating and his commercial license. Zander is currently attending Liberty University, where he is pursuing a degree in Aviation Management. He is also working on obtaining his certified flight instructor's rating.

The experience at Oshkosh that was made possible by Chapter 393 was an incredibly important and pivotal part of Zander's aviation education, and is another great success story for EAA Chapter 393.

Wednesday Fly-Outs

To maintain our proficiency, a number of pilots get together on Wednesdays and fly somewhere for lunch. Many of the aircraft owners in the chapter participate. Passengers are always welcome. Not only is it a great way to see the Bay Area, it's also fun to see and ride in our members' aircraft. You may contact HarvardHolmes@comcast.net to be added to or removed from this list.

Generally, someone who wants to go flying will send a suggestion to this list a day or two before. Those who can go will respond, and a destination gets selected. Recent destinations have included: South Lake Tahoe, Half Moon Bay, Santa Rosa, Ukiah, Boonville, Shelter Cove, Willows, Auburn, Lodi, Watsonville and Salinas. If the weather is poor, a destination may be selected as late as Wednesday morning.

The most active pilots on this list are George Grech, Harvard Holmes, Stu Schuster, Bob Tucknott, Carol Healey, and Clint Beacham. Pilots sometimes advertise that they have empty seats, but not always. Harvard Holmes, Carol Healey and Stu Schuster are most likely to have extra seats (4 seat aircraft). My advice is to contact a pilot in advance to make sure they have room and to get directions. Typically, you'd get to the airport by 11:00am and return by 4pm.
